

For over 70 years, the influential Fashion Calendar with its iconic pink pages laid out every fashion event in New York City, including New York Fashion Week. Behind it was founder Ruth Finley. In 2014, Ruth retired at 95 and sold the Fashion Calendar to the Council of Fashion Designers of America. This documentary examines that momentous transition, and reflects on the life, work, and legacy of this trailblazer and the industry Ruth helped create.

Cow, 636.2 Cow 2022

Academy Award winner Andrea Arnold returns with an intimate portrait of a dairy cow's life. The film chronicles the daily life of dairy cow Luma in an attempt for humans to understand her reality.

Hold Your Fire, 363.2019 Hol 2022

Brooklyn, 1973. When Shu'aib Raheem and his friends attempted to steal guns for self-defense, it sparked the longest hostage siege in NYPD history.

Inhabitants 306.45 Inh 2021

Follows five Native American communities across deserts, coastlines, forests, and prairies as they restore their traditional land management practices.

Jazz Fest: A New Orleans Story, 781.65079 Jaz 2022

Weaves together live performances and interviews from the 50th anniversary of the iconic festival featuring some of the biggest names in the music industry, along with a wealth of archival documentary footage from the past half century.

The Songbirds guitar museum hosted the world's largest collection of vintage guitars. Covid-19's devastating blow to the music industry forced the museum to permanently close. This documentary film explores the final hours and cultural impact of this special collection.
